Mission Statement

Eastwood Christian School is a ministry of Eastwood Presbyterian Church and is a Christ-centered, classical, college preparatory school (K4-12). Its educational philosophy is committed to discipling young people through academics taught with a Biblical worldview, so as to foster a love of learning and a passion for Jesus Christ. The school opened in 1996 and presently enrolls 245 students. Eastwood provides students with opportunities to grow through rigorous academics as well as extra-curricular activities including athletics, drama, yearbook, student government, etc.

Academic Program

Eastwood Christian School offers a core-curriculum, college preparatory program. The educational emphasis is based on the classical Trivium - grammar, logic, and rhetoric. Eastwood's Upper School course of study contains four years of History, English, Mathematics, Science, Latin, and Theology. Our Literature classes cover parallel historical periods each year. Eighth grade students take Logic. Rhetoric is taught in the 12th grade. All seniors are required to present and defend a research thesis before a faculty panel. The core-curriculum education provides a rigorous foundation for our graduates. They are academically prepared for a life of productivity and learning. One-hundred percent of them have chosen college education. Our academic day serves the students by allowing them to pursue a wide-range of interests and to explore enriching community activities; students may enter our sports and arts programs or they may pursue those offered in the Tri-Country area.

Community Service

Community service, while encouraged, is not mandated. Any community service hours recorded by Eastwood students were self-initiated and maintained.

Faculty

Eastwood seeks teachers who have mastery over their subject, passion for Jesus Christ, and skill in communication. Our Upper School teachers provide an 8:1 faculty/student ratio.
